Mary Ann Creamer is a 1979 graduate of St. Paul High School who touched the lives of many students over the years as a teacher and then as founder and executive director of Teen Leadership Corps. Mary Ann began by developing and teaching a service leadership class at Huron High School. At the time, it was the largest program of its kind in the state, one that had 50 percent of the senior students involved and that on consecutive years earned the program Ohio's Outstanding Leadership Team Award.

The program was cut in 2006, and Mary Ann decided she would take the program from classroom to corps. As the executive director, she was aided by 21 board members, 36 members of a youth council and countless volunteers. The mission of the non-profit organization is to bring academic service leadership programs to secondary school students and empower teens to make a difference in their schools and communities.

Mary Ann was a determined and passionately devoted individual. She was driven by her core beliefs and values. She was truly counter-cultural in that her organization teaches teens that their lives would be better served by following their beliefs.

Mary Ann, who was known as "Smacks" in high school, was a phenomenal student and an equally-fine athlete. She captained both the volleyball and basketball teams, competed at the state level in track, and was inducted into the St. Paul High Hall of Fame in 2015.
